# RULES

\* \* \* \* \*

1.—All articles shewn for prizes must have been the *bona fide* property of the exhibitor for at least one month before the show, and any competitor borrowing or otherwise obtaining any plants, &c., or attempting in any way to deceive the Judges, will be disqualified, and forfeit all entrance fees, and the names of such offenders will be communicated to the committees of other flower shows.

2.—Any member of the Committee may inspect the garden of any exhibitor, either previous to, or after the show.

3.—Exhibitors must provide their own trays, dishes, boxes, plates, &c.

4.—Entrance Fees, Threepence each class, except for children's classes, which are free.

5.—All Entrance Fees must be paid to the Secretary on or before Thursday, July 26th, at which date all entries close.

6.—All exhibits to be in the Show-room by 10-30 on the morning of the show. Judging to commence at 11.

7.—Subscribers of two shillings and upwards shall be free to compete in all classes, and have free admittance to the show. All exhibitors shall have free admission to the Show-room.

8.—No competitor shall be allowed to take more than one prize in one class.

9.—Vegetables and fruit (only) shall be at the disposal of the committee after the show.

10.—If only one competitor in any class, the second prize to be awarded.

11.—The show is open to all residents of Bishop Wilton with Bell Busby, Bolton, Yewthorpe, and Growthorpe.

12.—The Judges have power to withhold any prize if the exhibits are not considered worthy.

13.—The Judges' decision shall in all cases be final, and any disputes which may arise shall be settled by the Committee.
