

3. **Census enumerator's return for Blanch Farm, Warter 1901.** The farm covering 1,050 acres (425 hectares) was the largest on the Warter estate. There were 24 living in the farmhouse on 1 April 1901 including 14 male farm servants and 1 female farm servant. There was also a foreman's house on the farm and 6 labourers' cottages.

Key to headings of columns in transcription: **1** - Relation to Head of Family **2** - Condition as to Marriage. **3** and **4** Age last Birthday of Males (**3**) and Females (**4**) **5** - Employer, Worker or Own Account The place of birth in last column is in the East Riding of Yorkshire unless stated.
